It runs east and west halfway between the <b>North and South poles</b>.</p> <p>*The <b>Tropic of Cancer</b> and the <b>Tropic of Capricorn</b> are the two most important latitude lines made, apart from the equator.</p> <p>*<b>Tropic of Cancer</b> It is the beginning of summer in the <b>Northern Hemisphere</b> and the beginning of winters in the <b>Southern hemisphere</b>. <b>North of the Tropic of Cancer is the subtropics</b> and the Northern Temperate Zones. <b>South of the Tropic of Cancer are the Tropics</b>.
